Volunteer firefighters and emergency medical services (EMS) personnel are the backbone of emergency response in communities across New York. Yet in recent years, volunteer ranks have declined dramatically, threatening timely access to life-saving care and putting the safety of residents at greater risk.

Enhance Recruitment & Retention

- Create tuition forgiveness programs and provide municipal health benefits to volunteer fire and EMS
- Provide youth training opportunities
- Allow SUNY and CUNY to provide college credits for service learning programs
- Increase incentives to attract future volunteer fire and EMS recruits

Reward Our Volunteers

- Free use of state parks and campsites for volunteer fire and EMS
- Tax breaks for volunteer fire and EMS and for employers who hire them
- Increase reimbursement for personal protective equipment

Protect First Responders

- Prevent harassment of volunteer fire and EMS
- Protect first responders from exposure to dangerous drugs like fentanyl
- Ensure punishment for those purposely targeting first responders and volunteer fire and EMS when committing crimes
