Overly-Regulated

New York is the [2nd most regulated state](#) in the U.S. with over 300,000 State-level regulatory restrictions in 2023.



Unsustainable Budgets

New York has the 2nd largest state budget in the country, ahead of both Texas and Florida, even though they have larger [populations](#).



Lackluster Results

Even though New York spends the [most per pupil](#) on K-12 education in the country, academic performance when compared to other states has been "[in the middle of the pack](#)."

Our Plan

Reorganize State Government

- Modernize State services to adjust to technological advancements
- Reduce and reform our regulatory system
- Provide legislative oversight of Executive agencies

State Spending Reforms

- Create greater oversight of all State debt
- Implement a State Spending Cap
- Provide nonpartisan policy and fiscal analysis to elected officials

Limit Executive Power

- Restrict State Emergency Declarations by the Governor
- Provide oversight of Climate Change actions by the Executive

Audit Failed Policies

- Require the Comptroller to audit funds for aid to illegal migrants in New York
- Repeal congestion pricing and require an independent forensic audit of the MTA
